REGULATIONS FOR STUDENT CLASS WORK DURING SUSPENSION

In-School Suspensions

Students given in-school suspension will be allowed to make up their class work and assignments without academic penalty if they meet deadlines established by the teacher for all other students in the respective classes.

- 1. Assignment sheets will be distributed to the students' teachers. Teachers are asked to list the students' assignments for the suspension period.
- 2. Students will work on these assignments while in I.S.S. Work will be checked off at the end of each day.
- 3. If a student is deemed disruptive and/or uncooperative while in I.S.S., no work will be accepted and no credit will be given.

Students refusing to serve their suspension in school will be suspended out-of-school.

Out-of-School Suspensions

- Students suspended from school may make up work missed only one time. A student suspended a second time will be denied credit for all work missed for the duration of that and any subsequent suspensions. The opportunity to make up work while on suspension will be afforded to students once during his/her enrollment at CMS and once during his/her enrollment at CHS.
- 2. At any time during the due process proceedings, an administrator may reinstate a student if it becomes apparent that there is any question regarding appropriateness of the suspension. In that case, all suspension records are destroyed, all work is made up, and the student is reinstated with full privileges.
